REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES FOR HORSE

CLASSIFICATION

1. Only Classifiers approved by the Association may classify horses
2. Horses must be three years or older to be presented. (Calculated from 1 August)
3. The Association's Standard of Excellence is the minimum standard.
4. All horses must be measured by an approved person, by rod measure on a flat concrete or similar surface. Minimum height for *Stallions* is 140 cms and for *Mares* 135cms. Smaller horses will be rejected.
No height minimum is required for *Geldings*.
5. Horses must exhibit a calm quiet temperament and must be able to be closely inspected. Failure in this regard means that the horse will be rejected.
6. Classifiers inspecting crossbred horses may make allowance for colour on a prorata basis depending on generation, bearing in mind that the aim is to produce a true "haflinger type" after the 5th cross.
Crossbred *Females* are classified in the same manner as *purebreds*
Crossbred *Males* may only be classified when they have been gelded
7. Blemishes, such as wire marks which do not affect the horses movement are not detrimental and must not be used to withhold classification.
8. Application for reclassification may be made at any future classification day. The score achieved at the latest representation is the recorded score.
9. Unclassified horses may not be used for breeding of registrable progeny.
Unclassified horses over four years of age may not be shown in Haflinger Breed Classes.
10. Decisions of the classifiers at the time of inspection shall be binding. Appeals against any decision must be made to the Board in writing for their consideration at the next Board meeting.
